The Big Give SA Presents Powerful Fund-raising Opportunity for TIFD/SAFDF by Lissa Bengtson



The Big Give S.A. is an annual 24-hour day of giving, and this year San Antonio Folk Dance Festival/Texas International Folk Dancers will be a part of it. It happens in a 24-hour period, on May 3, 2016. It brings donors and nonprofits together by creating a shared region-wide experience, connecting people to the causes that matter to them the most.

Last year the San Antonio area raised \$4.3 million dollars for 882 charitable causes. The minimum donation is only \$10, but organizations can qualify for various monetary prizes, which increase the donations received AND create a fun, competitive atmosphere.

An example of great fund-raising last year was the Congregation of Divine Providence, the founders of Our Lady of the Lake University. OLLU students helped the Sisters mount an appeal in the wee hours of the morning from 2 to 3 am. They had previously notified their known donors and all the student body that the wee hours were their focus. They had computers ready in their meeting hall, and lots of refreshments for donors that came by. As a result, they had so many donations during that time that they won the "most number of donations" prize for that time period, which doubled their fund-raising effort-up to a 5-digit amount!

IFCC Folk Dancing Moves to Sunday Afternoons

Folk Dancing at the International Folk Culture Center has moved to Sunday afternoons from 1 to 3 pm. Dancers are treated to healthy refreshments (mostly fruit) each Sunday, and have the option of staying for more dancing with the Bluebonnet

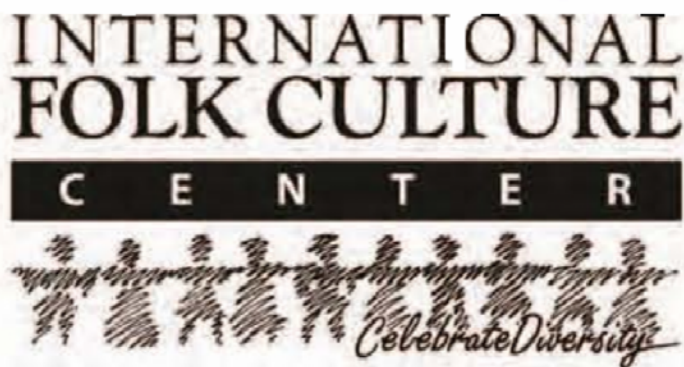
Scottish Country Dancers, who meet from 3 to 6 pm. Dancers who attended 8 of the 10 Sundays preceding the San Antonio Folk Dance Festival will be awarded a full scholarship to the Festival. Dances during the two-hours of fun include international folk dances as well as U.S. line dances.

International Folk Dancing to Be Represented at San Antonio's Siclovía

San Antonio Folk Dance Festival, the International Folk Culture Center, and other San Antonio folk dancers will participate in this year's Siclovía, a free bi-annual event that turns several major San Antonio streets into a safe place for people to exercise, bike, walk and play. Siclovía takes place Sunday April 3, from 11 am to 3 pm.

The route is car-free for 5 hours and families can enter the route at any point via biking or walking. Dogs are welcome! Exercise classes along the route, which wanders through streets of downtown San Antonio, offer samples of healthy family-friendly activities. The IFCC/SAFDF will sponsor an International Folk Dance Stop, to spread the word about our favorite form of exercise. We're allowed to hand out 5x7 postcards with information about dance times and locations, and will mention TIFD's participation in The Big Give SA! Join us!

The vision was determined by San Antonio citizens in 2010, who identified 11 "cause" areas where improvement was needed. SAFDF fits into the vision through the Arts & Culture Cause, and the Health & Fitness Cause. As a result of this partnership, SAFDF is being connected to other like-minded organizations, and has been "Certified Awesome" by SA2020.
