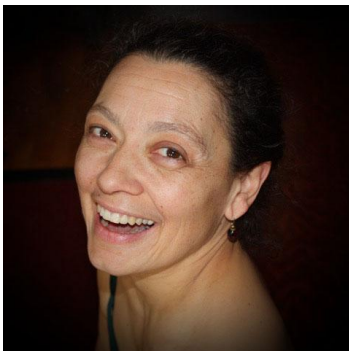


Your teachers for Texas Camp 2019

Tineke van Geel and **Maurits van Geel** are a dynamic couple who teach international dance. **Tineke** has worked as a folk dance teacher since 1975 with close ties to Armenia, the country of her dance specialization. She attended classes at the Choreographic School and at the Pedagogical Institute in Yerevan and received an award from the Armenian Ministry of Culture for being an ambassador promoting Armenian dance and culture. Tineke is known



as an outstanding professional teacher and has taught dance workshops on various continents. **Maurits** has been active as a dance teacher, lecturer, and choreographer since 1975. From 1988 to 2011 he worked at the International Dance Theater, serving as artistic director for 15 of those years. He directed 47 productions based on field research, often in collaboration with local ethnomusicologists. He regularly made research journeys around the world, traveled in various countries that were part of the Silk Road, and did extensive research on two dance productions about the Roma.



Andy Taylor-Blenis and **Ricardo (Ricky) César Gaitán Muñoz** have paired up to teach the dances of the renowned Nelda Guerrero Drury. **Andy** graduated from the University of Massachusetts at Amherst with a BFA in dance and is the daughter of the co-founders of the Folk Arts Center of New England. She teaches international dance through the Folk Arts Center, Revels Inc., and Mass Movement. In addition, she has taught at Harvard, Emerson, Boston University, Boston Conservatory, and the Jeannette Neill Dance Studio. Andy is currently director of

the Mladost Folk Ensemble, a group she founded in 2006, and has danced for 19 years with the Prometheus Dance Company and also dances with the RSCDS Demonstration Team and Wheaton College Dance Group. Andy is a frequent teacher at the San

Antonio Folk Dance Festival.

Ricky began his dance training at age 5 with the Instituto Cultural Mexicano. By age 13 he was a soloist with the Ballet Esplendor de México. In 1973 he joined the San Antonio College Folk Dancers and under the direction of Professor Nelda Guerrero Drury performed throughout the United States and Mexico. From 1977 to 1994 he was associated with the Nacional Aztlán de México in Mexico City as a member, soloist, and dance captain. Ricky is currently director of Ballet Folklórico Alegría at the James Bonham Academy of the San Antonio Independent School District.



Shirley Johnson returns as our singing teacher. Shirley grew up singing, dancing, and playing the accordion. She sang with the Duke University Chorale, and in 1979 provided the musical accompaniment for the Pittsburgh Area Slovaks as they performed in Czechoslovakia. From 1992 to 1994 she performed in Rome, at the Vatican, and on Italian radio and TV. In 2016 she toured Spain with Michelle Alany and Nefesh Joykestra and recorded her third CD.
