

Restated Certificate of Formation¹ of Texas International Folk Dancers

ARTICLE ONE

The name of the corporation is Texas International Folk Dancers.

ARTICLE TWO

The corporation is a nonprofit corporation.

ARTICLE THREE

The period of its duration is perpetual.

ARTICLE FOUR²

The purpose for which the corporation is organized is educational to wit:

1. To promote or sponsor educational courses in traditional folk dance, music, arts and crafts native to a variety of countries.
2. To promote or sponsor educational courses and materials for teachers, instructors, recreational leaders and interested persons in the use of folk dance, music, arts and crafts for physical education, recreational and social purposes.
3. To disseminate information relating to its purpose among its members and interested persons.
4. To encourage and assist local groups with programs or interests similar to that of the corporation's or to charter local groups to carry out the corporation's purpose.
5. To engage in such other ancillary activities as may be necessary to carry out the corporation's purpose.

ARTICLE FIVE

The street address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 1518 Villanova Drive, Austin, Texas, and the name of its initial registered agent at such address is Mr. Alan E. Barnes.

ARTICLE SIX

The number of trustees constituting the initial board of trustees of the corporation is twelve, and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as the initial trustees are

ARTICLE EIGHT³

Information regarding the corporation's operations and structure shall be set in the bylaws of the corporation.

ARTICLE NINE⁴

The property of the corporation is irrevocably dedicated to Texas International Folk Dancers. No part of the net income or assets of the corporation shall ever inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, officers, directors or other private individuals, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and expenses incurred and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Four.

ARTICLE TEN⁴

No part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in nor intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of the corporation.

ARTICLE ELEVEN⁵

The assets of the corporation are dedicated to the purposes set out in Article Four. In event of dissolution of the corporation, the trustees shall pay, or make provision for payment of, all liabilities of the corporation. The remaining assets of the corporation shall be distributed to a trust, dedicated to the same purposes as those of the corporation and administered under the same conditions as set forth in the corporation's Articles of Incorporation, by a designated corporation incorporated exclusively for educational purposes.

ARTICLE TWELVE⁵

An amendment to these articles may be proposed by the board of directors of the corporation or by written petition of at least 10% of the members of the corporation. Any such proposal shall specify the proposed amendment and shall be submitted by the board of directors to a vote of the members having voting rights at an annual or special meeting of the corporation. Approval of the proposed amendment must be by at least two-thirds of the votes that members of the corporation who are present in person or by proxy are entitled to cast at the meeting at which the action is submitted for a vote. No amendment

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shall be made to these articles that would cause the corporation to cease to qualify as an exempt corporation under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, or the corresponding section of any future Federal tax code.

ARTICLE THIRTEEN⁵

If any term of these articles is to any extent illegal, otherwise invalid, or incapable of being enforced, such term shall be excluded to the extent of such invalidity or unenforceability and all other terms hereof shall remain in full force and effect. To the extent permitted and possible, the invalid or unenforceable term shall be replaced by the trustees of the corporation with a term that is valid and enforceable and that comes closest to expressing the intention of such invalid or unenforceable term.
